Message from your President

 ${f I}$ wish all of you a Happy New Year and pray that each of you had a very Merry Christmas.

I look forward to serving all of you this coming year. Likewise, I look forward to working with our Governing Board to continue making our Cars Club of Sun Cities (Club) a well-respected Club and at the same time a fun Club. In order for this to happen, I will continue to seek input and help from all of you. I will endeavor to keep you informed about various happenings in the Club and to set forth some of the problems that, as I see it, we are facing.

We have over 70 Couples and over 25 Single members in our Club. When I consider each Single/Couple and that each Single/Couple would own at least one Show Car, I come up with at least 95 Show Cars in our Club. Ninety-five (95) is a very conservative number, since I know that many of our members have more than one car. Even with 95 Show Cars, we seem to have had difficulties, in the past, in getting enough Show Cars to fill our contractual quotes. We further agree to show the cars for a predefined period of time on an established date. If we fail to follow through with the terms of the Contract, we effectively have broken the Contract and the reasons for breaking the Contract must be addressed. This not only creates problems between our Club and the Business/Client, it also makes our Club seem untrust-worthy.

All Car Shows are noted in the monthly News Letter, along with who to call in order to Sign-Up for an upcoming show. Once you have registered for a Car Show, please make a personal reminder so that you don't inadvertently forget to show up at the scheduled Car Show. I know that I have to make a personal reminder for myself, otherwise, I can be guilty of forgetting meeting, etc. If you are having problems getting signed up for a Car Show, please let me know about it and I will attempt to help correct the problem. We, the Governing Board, are looking at ways to permit Members to show their Cars as alternates and get credit for showing their cars) to meet the required number of Car Shows for the year Currently 2). When showing as an Alternate, you would not get a Token. Again, we are trying to overcome any hang-ups in our system.

In order to try to keep this letter reasonably short, I will close with the following comments. I know that all of us are busy and, most likely, involved in many other clubs/activities. All clubs/activities normally require some degree of time commitment. Our Club is no different than other clubs/activities. I joined our Club to aid a friend, meet new people, see and enjoy older cars, and hopefully help the Club. TOP FIVE ODDEST CLASSIC CAR FEATURES

Lightning Rods Shifter – 1984 Oldsmobile Hurst: The perfect option for any automotive enthusiast who just can't get enough levers, the Lightning Rods shifter walks a very strange line between a typical automatic and a full ratchet shifter. As goofy as it may look, Lightning Rods have no problem putting the power to the ground.

Swivel Seats – 1975 Chevrolet Laguna S3: It's a wonder that more cars weren't offered with swiveling seats, seeing as those troublesome stationary seats are always such a bother

Jay Leno Gives Wounded Veteran a 2015 Dodge Challenger SRT Hellcat

Most people show their support for veterans with thank yous, patriotic bumper sticker, and small charity donations. But Jay Leno isn't most people. The former talkshow host and all around car fanatic recently took a wounded veteran for a ride in a **2015 Dodge Challenger SRT Helicat**, then tossed him the keys.

Leno wanted to do something that would bring a little fun into a veteran's life as part of *The Today Show's* ongoing Shine A Light series. So he gave Corporal Ethan Leberge a ride in the Hellcat - then gave him the car. Leberge was injured in a suicidebomber attack in Afghanistan that also killed two soldiers. He sustained shrapnel wounds to his left leg and arm, and suffered a traumatic brain injury.

Leno said that when he meets soldiers he finds that they're often "worlds apart", but he and Leberge quickly bonded over their mutual love of cars, and Leberge jumped at the chance to take a ride in the Hellcat. Leno has found plenty of *nice things to say about the Hellcat* in the past, and Leberge was - not surprisingly - impressed by the 707 horsepower muscle car as well.

"I wouldn't mind having one of these," he said, after which Leno handed him the keys.

"America loves you," Leno said, "Thanks you buddy. Have lots of fun. Don't get any tickets." Leberge said he couldn't promise that, and who could blame him?

California Bill to Create "Road Usage fee" Pilot Program Signed into Law

Legislation (S.B. 1077) to establish an advisory committee to study a road usage fee was signed into law by California Governor Jerry Brown. Under the new law, the group will propose the tax as an alternative to the gas tax and make recommendations on the design of a pilot program.

According to supporters, a road usage fee will distribute the gas tax burden across all vehicles regardless of fuel source and minimize the impact of the current regressive gas tax structure. According to opponents, the law will penalize national efforts to create a more fuel efficient vehicle fleet by taxing drivers based on vehicle mileage. As gas tax revenues decrease due to hybrid and electric vehicle ownership, states are looking for new sources of funding for pet projects.

Your Federal Government is currently exploring a similar plan which is said to impose a \$0.15 per mile driven tax on all vehicles nationwide.


